Visit to the Resettlement Programme of the city of Lyon (Friday 21 June)

9.30am Visit to the Transit Centre

Meet at the Centre, 19 rue de la Baïsse - 69100 Villeurbanne

The refugee transit centre of Forum Réfugiés-Cosi is one of 2 Transit Centres in France. The other centre in Créteil is managed by France Terre d'Asile. The centre welcomes people seeking asylum until such time as a vacancy becomes available in one of 271 centres for asylum seekers (CADA) in France. In the framework of the resettlement programme, the Transit Centre welcomes households resettled on an emergency basis, and/or resettled refugee families for whom housing is not immediately available. Staff at the Transit Centre support resettled families throughout the asylum procedure that begins directly after their arrival.

10.30am Visit to the Temporary Accommodation Centre

10 place Latarjet, 69008 Lyon

The Temporary Accommodation Centre (CPH - centre provisoire d'hébergement) has the capacity to welcome up to 40 individuals in households that have received international protection after an asylum application. CPH aims to prepare refugees for the social and professional settlement and integration process in France. In the framework of the resettlement programme, CPH provides very short-term accommodation to households so that apartments can be made ready for their arrival. Another centre, the CADA-IR (Centre for the Reception of Asylum Seekers) is dedicated to receiving less vulnerable refugee households, for whom it provides short-term accommodation between the arrival of the family and the point at which they move into their new apartment.

11.30am Visit to the apartment of Mr. Maurufi and his family

Rillieux-la-Pape, max. 8 people

Mr Maurifi is an Afghan refugee resettled to France from Ukraine with his family. The household was first accommodated in the CPH whilst final preparations for the apartment took place, and Mr Maurufi and his family moved into their home in May 2013.
